Labor Day Weekend August 31st -- September 3rd

Those of you who have been to been to Big Sur know it has some of the most spectacular coastline in the country. Set against a backdrop of mountains freckled with coastal redwoods, it's easy to imagine that the Indians called this land God's Country. They didn't \dots but you can imagine that they might have.

We'll be camping in Pfeiffer Big Sur State Park. Our campsites are along the Big Sur River, which runs through the campground, and eventually empties into the Pacific at a point we'll see along one of our hikes. The campground is in a very pretty, wooded setting. Conveniently, there are showers right in the campground, walking distance from our campsites.

We'll be treated to a full moon over Labor Day weekend, making the evenings in Big Sur particularly pretty. The weather is usually quite good there at this time of year. The days should be pleasantly warm, and the evenings cool but not cold (he said, jinxing the group to endure a typhoon).

This is a gorgeously located resort hotel with beautiful views of both the mountains and ocean. We'll then return to camp for dinner.

The trip will cost \$35, including the campsites, firewood, common supplies, a couple cases of wine, beer for the weekend, etc. Everyone will be asked to help prepare one meal, and will be served by the group for the other meals. On this trip, all meals from dinner Friday through breakfast Monday will be served to the group, including lunches.

We can only take 25 people on this trip. First preference will be given to everyone who'll be joining us for the whole weekend, through breakfast on Monday.
